The iShuttle serves residents, employees, and employers in the Irvine Spectrum Area and the Irvine Business Complex (IBC) by taking commuters and residents to and from work and home. These routes specifically connect commuters to morning and evening Metrolink and Amtrak trains from Irvine Station and Metrolink trains from Tustin Station. Bikeways

The City provides a system of on-street and off-street bikeways to encourage the use of a bicycle as a safe and convenient means of transportation for both commuting and recreational purposes. 
Solid Waste Franchise Area Map

Commercial Waste Reduction And Recycling Assistance Program

The City offers free waste assessments to help start or improve recycling at Irvine businesses. These free assessments include:

- Onsite visits and advice by qualified waste consultants
- Review of current waste and recycling program
- Preparation of customized waste reduction report with recommendations and resources for materials, activities, and contractual modifications
- Follow-up assistance to establish/expand waste reduction and recycling programs

This program promotes the “**Triple Bottom Line**”:

- 1) Economic:** Recycling services are typically less expensive than trash service
- 2) Environmental:** Recycling conserves natural resources
- 3) Social:** Private and public sector recycling and environmental programs expand employment opportunities, creating good “green collar” jobs

What Is “Zero Waste”?

Zero Waste is a principal that promotes waste minimization, recycling, composting, sustainable consumption, and product reuse. The City's Zero Waste policy promotes these concepts and encourages everyone to:

- Use less and use longer
- Increase recycling and composting
- Use recycled-content and biodegradable products
- Reuse products whenever possible
- Ask manufacturers to take back products for recycling or proper disposal

Commercial Solid Waste Options

Businesses located in Irvine's exclusive franchise area receive trash and recycling services from Waste Management of Orange County.

All other businesses in Irvine can select from a number of service providers for trash and recycling bin collection services under a non-exclusive franchise agreement with the City. These providers use different methods to achieve recycling goals, so be sure to ask for information about their specific programs. Construction & Demolition Debris Recycling Ordinance

Construction and demolition debris makes up about 20% of the trash in our landfills. To encourage the diversion of this material from landfills, the City's Ordinance 07-18 requires certain projects to reuse or recycle:

- 75% of concrete and asphalt, and
- 50% of all other debris generated from construction, demolition, or tenant improvement projects in the City.

For projects covered by the ordinance thresholds, project applicants must:

- Submit and obtain City approval of a **Pre-Project Waste Management Plan**
- Post a refundable **Waste Diversion Fee Deposit** (maximum \$50,000)
- Submit and obtain City approval of a **Post-Project Final Report**

Reducing, reusing, and recycling construction and demolition debris during renovation or construction significantly contributes to resource conservation and waste minimization.

Don't Trash It!

It is illegal to place the following in trash or recycling bins:

- batteries
- some electronic devices
- compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs)
- medical sharps

Generally, businesses must pay for the collection and proper disposal or recycling of hazardous wastes. Referrals to hazardous waste collection providers can be found through OC Waste & Recycling's hazardous waste section at oclandfills.com.
